This is done for the purpose of checking work health and safety performance and to make improvements.

We ensure that 100% of all new workers and contractors have completed an induction before starting their duties with Powerhouse,

- We aim for zero workplace incidents,
- We aim for zero lost time injuries (LTIs),

We are committed to complying with the current work health and safety laws in Western Australia:

- Occupational Safety & Health Regulations 1996
- WHS Codes of Practice
